Dear Parents and Carers,

The dark nights and bad weather are definitely closing in but that hasn't dampened our spirits in school. St Peter's remains positive in the face of adversity and I hope many of the announcements in this update will also cheer you up.

## **Nursery**

This week, children have been driving their role play GREEN tractor and exploring things they might find on a farm. Pigs, cows, sheep and even scarecrows, which they enjoyed dressing up as for Scarecrow Day! They shared scarecrow stories, action songs and learnt where their fruit and vegetables come from as well as sampling lots of different and tasty varieties! The children have learnt different positional language from Daisy the Cow as she hid <u>under</u> the table, <u>next</u> to the box and even on <u>top</u> of their heads! ### **PTA**

Share Your Work (Reception to Year 6) - Monday 19th October

Share your work will happen this year, but we're going digital. Your child and their teacher will photograph and video work they're proud of and it will be uploaded to Google Classroom just for you to see. Any group or class work will be put on the Classroom feed and amazing work will be put in the Hall of Fame. For new parents, Google classroom is a virtual space for teachers and children to share work and all of your children have login details. Make sure they show you at home what they've been working on and enjoy looking at their work. When it's safe to do so we'll invite you all in to see their classrooms and all the lovely new displays.

Parent Teacher Consultations - (Reception to Year 6) Monday 16th & Tuesday 17th November

These will be via video call on Google Meet this term. A usual ParentMail form will be sent to you for you to indicate a day and time that works well for you and teachers will then schedule an online meeting.

Year Group Assemblies - Year 6, Monday 16th November, Year 5, Monday 23rd November

Subject to guidance, I hope that we'll be able to invite a limited number of parents to a Year group assembly where you can be socially-distanced in the hall wearing masks. Your children can then perform for you in person and online to the rest of the school watching in their classrooms. We'll confirm more details nearer the time if we feel it's still safe to do this.







### **Open Day and Tours**

Open Day was due to be next week and for obvious reasons this won't be taking place in its usual form. We are offering personalised, COVID-safe tours to parents who would like to look around the school. These are limited in size and number and must be booked in advance. These tours don't enter classrooms and masks must be worn if anyone is on-site. If you know anyone who would be interested in St Peter's School or Sunnylands Nursery please ask them to get in touch with the school office and we'll arrange a visit at a suitable time.

# **Swimming & Games Kit**

We've now had a second week of successful swimming and the children are growing in confidence. If, for any reason, your child is unable to swim please email the school office in advance. We are no longer able to take non-swimmers to the pool as spectators and your child's class and teacher won't be in school, so alternative plans need to be made. If your child is too ill to swim, they shouldn't be in school. Swimming is part of your child's physical education and it's important that they attend each week. Also, children from Year 3 upwards must remember their Games kits on Games afternoons. This includes football/rugby boots, tracksuits and shin pads. We know that children are currently coming into school in their PE kit on these days but they may be on the grass playing games in the wet.
