 School Office and the relevant people will be informed. Don't send this information
 directly to the class teacher. Absences should be requested in advance via
 ParentMail.
- 2. Please send positive news back via Google Classroom and GMail. I know that the teachers really appreciate hearing positive things about what the children have done at home and their achievements. You are welcome to comment on their 'Share Your Work'.
- 3. Please be mindful that you won't get an immediate response from teachers, especially outside of working hours. Teachers will be in the classroom teaching throughout the day and may not have the opportunity to respond straight away. If you require a quick response, please send your question or concern to the School Office which is staffed from 8am until 3:45pm.
