Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have all had a good week and are looking forward to a restful weekend. Some important Covid announcements as well as some fun this week!

End of day

There are some minor, but important, changes to the end of day procedures to keep everyone safe and socially-distanced. Only one gate will be open with one teacher on duty, and children won't be brought to the gate until their parent is at the front of the line or clearly visible. Can all parents line up, socially-distanced, up the Crescent and please don't call your child when you can see them. If you need to talk to a teacher please request a call or email them rather than asking any questions at the gate, to allow for a quick and safe pickup. Alternatively, if it's something the School Office can sort out, please message Miss Wills. Your child's safety is the most important thing to us and I have therefore asked teachers not to have these conversations with you at pickup. It's also really important that you notify the School Office, in advance, if somebody different is collecting your child. Lastly, parents collecting from the Hub should wait outside and not enter the building. Any parent on school grounds should wear a face mask.
