# Return to School - 8th March

We return to relative normality. Early and Late Clubs will restart on Monday and we're prepared for the children's return. School will feel much like it did in September with hand sanitising and social-distancing. Year groups and their teachers will be staying apart where possible but, most importantly, the children will be with their class teachers and friends in the real world again. The government has stated that school attendance is mandatory from Monday 8th March unless you have a letter instructing you to shield. Google Classrooms will remain open but will become less active. Teachers may still post homework and activities online for children who may be self-isolating or shielding. Please socially-distance on The Crescent and wear a face covering for all of our safety. Our staff will be wearing face coverings at drop-off and collection and they'll stay 2m away from you - please help keep them safe by staying back and remaining patient. Thank you.

## **Primary School Parent Lateral Flow Test**

COVID-19 rapid lateral flow tests are now available to all families with primary aged children.

This testing is only for adults in the family - primary school aged children aren't being tested at this time unless they display COVID-19 symptoms in which case they should be booked in for a test at a local centre.







About 1 in 3 people with Coronavirus don't have symptoms but can still pass it on to others.

We hope all of our families will participate in twice weekly testing to help keep the school community infection free and minimise the risk of further disruption to learning. If you're already being tested through your workplace you don't need to take any additional action.

If you aren't accessing tests through your work, you can collect 2 packs of home test kits at a local collection point. Each pack contains 7 tests and is provided free of charge. In Kettering, the collection points are the London Road test site and the Kettering Conference Centre test site. Tests can be collected by anyone over 18. Find your nearest home test kit collection point. If families are unable to collect test kits, it's possible to order these for delivery but the government has asked that you don't do this if you're able to get a test in another way as this will free up deliveries for those who need them most.
