





Dear Parents and Carers,

The news from around the world this week has been quite bleak so I'll try to keep this update both informative and uplifting.

Living with COVID

You'll have seen the latest changes to COVID-19 guidance from the government this week. Our principles of returning to normality and providing an inspiring, warm environment run alongside keeping the children, staff and school community as safe as possible. We'll be following the government and DfE guidance which means that children should be in school unless they have signs or symptoms of COVID or have tested positive. If this is the case, we advise you to be cautious. Although there are no legal requirements to self-isolate, we don't want poorly or potentially infectious children in school. If you're in any doubt, keep your child at home and ask the School Office for advice. We'll still be cautious and continue to send children home who show signs of illness. As ever, this guidance is dynamic and in anticipation of this, we have provision to relax and step-up measures if required. I know you'll support us in working together to provide the best and safest experience for the children whilst minimising risks proportionately. Google Classrooms will remain open but will now be used exclusively for teachers as a teaching tool rather than a Home Learning platform. If your child is ill at home, they should be resting and recovering.
