

<p>Mathematical Development</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Count in order to 10 ● Name shapes ● Talk about and recognise simple patterns ● Use positional language e.g. under, above, below ● Can match some numbers to quantities 	<p>Literacy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Start to recognise letter names and sounds ● Write letter shapes and our names ● Listen to stories with increasing recall ● Describe settings, events, characters and possible endings ● Look at books independently 
<p>Physical Development</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Become aware of space – playing games ● Gain confidence and control with large and small equipment ● Move bodies in different ways and control movements ● Handle tools correctly e.g. pencils, scissors, brushes with increasing control ● Gymnastics and dance ● Observe their bodies - communicating when hungry, tired etc. ● Explore cooking and healthy diets 	<p>Personal and Social Development</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Learn the rules and routines of school and the classroom ● Personal hygiene (washing hands frequently) ● Take part in circle time ● Express likes and dislikes ● Develop social skills - can play in a group with confidence ● Take turns ● Aware of feelings 
<p>Language & Communication Skills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Recognise our names ● Listen to stories and joins in ● Enjoy rhymes & action songs ● Create representations of people ● Follows instructions ● Understands use of objects ● Questions using more complex sentences and a range of tenses 	<p>Expressive Arts</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Art - creating pictures, sculptures etc. ● Experiment with mixing colours ● Print using a range of materials ● Role play ● Sing and experiment with sound, instruments and movement ● Body percussion and make instruments ● Uses various construction materials
