Scrapes, Bumps and Accidents.

Children aged between 2 and 5 often have minor injuries:-

- •Still finding balance
- •Growing, legs and arms are not where they were yesterday!
- •Other things are more important than looking where you are going.
- •Often don't put their hands out to save themselves, clothing can hamper movement.
- •Some, or frequent accidents, may indicate problems that need further investigation.
- •Eyes and ears.
- •Unaware of risks.
- •New shoes

Nursery Friendships

- •Early Years children often play alongside rather than with others.
- Special friendships usually begin to form from Reception Class upwards.
- •Solo play is a stage of development where a child becomes absorbed in an activity to the exclusion of others.
- •Children can develop a relationship with another child, where they seek each other out to play but then find it hard to play cooperatively



Parents Meetings

- The nursery holds an evening meeting termly.
- This gives parents an opportunity to look at the displays in our rooms, talk to staff and see the work their child has produced.
- Dates will be on the school calendar.

Reports

- Reports are produced by your child's Keyworker.
- The report at the end of your child's first term is a summary of the child's first experiences. For children already in the nursery a progress report is produced half way through the school year.
- Photographs and Tapestry learning points are to be sent to parents every half term, beginning February 2023.
- Report at the end of Trinity Term is either Transition to Reception or progress depending on the child's appending
