Nursery News

This week in nursery we have been following one child's deep interest in recycling by setting up Sunnylands' Recycling Center. Amid much discussion of what and how we can achieve this the children have worked together to identify and sort paper, card, plastic and clothes into different bins and then find out what happens next at the recycling plant. Using recycled card from cereal boxes the children have created beautiful pictures of the earth using icing sugar and pipette painting. The unexpected snow prompted lots of in the moment planning. This is when children engage in activities they have chosen for themselves, they become highly involved and then deep learning can take place. In order to support this we try to follow the children's interests as much as possible. The children enjoyed rolling, shaping and patting the snow to construct snowmen and snowballs; making, counting and comparing the size of footprints, and discussing how snow feels: cold, wet, soft. Exploring the snow continued indoors when we filled the water tray with snow and used the pipettes to add drops of different colours. The children were immersed in their play as they experimented with mixing colours and discussed how the snow changes state from solid to liquid as it warms up!

Snow Days & Winter Wear

Everyone in school had lots of fun on Thursday when the whole school was covered in a blanket of white. The sound of children rolling snowballs and building snowmen could be heard from afar. It also recreated traditional scenes from years gone by, with socks drying on radiators and coats dripping dry in the changing rooms - what precious memories were made.
