



# St Peter's School Uniform Guide

*Smart from Head to Toe!*

At St Peter's, we are proud of how smart and well-presented our children look. This guide will help you make sure your child has everything they need; clearly laid out from head to toe, for both academic and sports days.

## HEADWEAR

### Winter Hats

- Girls: Grey felt hat with hatband (compulsory)
- Boys: Grey school cap (compulsory)
- All: Navy school beanie (for cold sports days)

### Summer Hats

- Girls: Straw boater with hatband (compulsory)
- Boys: Grey school cap (same as winter)
- All: Summer Cap (for sunny days)

 Hats must be worn to and from school every day (boys' grey caps, girls' felt hats or boaters), at school events, and on outings.

## HAIR

- Hair should be clean, neat, and natural in style and colour
- Long hair, which falls into the face, must be tied back with blue, black or white (simple) clips or bands
- Boys' hair should be no longer than collar length
- Hats must be worn comfortably and securely, so hair should be styled to fit the hat.
- One pair of small stud earrings may be worn in the ear lobes (must be removed for PE and swimming)
- No nail varnish or make-up allowed

## NECKWEAR

- School Tie:
  - Reception to Year 2 boys: Elasticated school tie
  - Year 3+ boys: Self-tie school tie
  - Year 6 girls: May wear a tie with winter uniform (with a white shirt)

 All ties must be worn neatly with top buttons done up.

## **UPPER BODY (CLASSROOM UNIFORM)**

### Boys

- White long-sleeved shirt (winter)
- White short-sleeved shirt (summer)
- Grey school jumper (with logo)

N.B. We do not sell white shirts. These should be plain and smart.

### Girls

- Blue and white check blouse (winter)
- Blue school cardigan (with logo)
- Summer dress (knee-length)

 Shirts must be tucked in at all times and sleeves should not be rolled up.

## **OUTERWEAR**

- School blazer – worn all year, to and from school
- Navy school coat – warm and smart, to be worn over the blazer in cold weather
- Rain mac – navy blue, lightweight option for wet days
- School scarf and gloves – for cold months

 No non-regulation coats, hats, gloves, scarves or hoodies, please.

## **LOWER BODY (CLASSROOM UNIFORM)**

### Boys

- Grey trousers (winter - with school crest from Sept 2025)
- Grey shorts (summer - with school crest from Sept 2025)
- Grey socks

### Girls

- Grey pleated skirt or grey pinafore (winter – both with school crest from Sept 2025)
- Knee-length blue summer dress (summer)
- Grey tights or long socks (winter), plain white ankle socks (summer – no frills or logos)

## **FOOTWEAR**

- Black formal school shoes – clean, polishable, and smart
- PE: Plain white, non-marking trainers
- Y1+: Football boots (no metal studs)

 No boots, sandals, or fashion trainers.

## **SOCKS (PE)**

- PE: Plain white ankle socks (Rec+)
- Games: Blue school games socks (Y1 to Y6)

## **SPORTS UNIFORM**

### All Pupils

- Navy PE top with logo
- Navy PE shorts (boys), Navy skort (girls – shorts also allowed for training)
- Full tracksuit (¼ zip top and Kukri tracksuit bottoms – compulsory from Sept 2025)
- Optional: Navy school base layer for cold weather and Mid-layer jumper (¼ zip, replaced hoodie)

### Y1–Y6

- Long games socks
- Gum shield
- Football boots
- Shin pads
- Y2+ House colour T-shirt

### Swimming (Y1–Y6)

- School Speedo swimsuit (girls) or school jammers (boys)
- House-colour swim cap (Y1+)
- No goggles provided (optional)
- Drawstring swim bag
- Towel (not provided by school)

## **BAGS & EQUIPMENT**

- All: PE/Swim Bag - Drawstring style with school logo
- School Bag:
  - Rec–Y2: Satchel and/or book bag
  - Y3–Y6: School backpack and sports holdall

## **DAILY SCHOOL ESSENTIALS**

Every pupil should have:

- Y3-Y6 - St Peter's planner (with timetable)
- Y3-Y6 - Pencil case with:
  - Writing pen & HB pencil
  - Ruler, eraser & sharpener
  - Pritt Stick
  - Colouring pencils
  - Scientific calculator (Y5+)
  - Protractor & compass (Y5+)
- R-Y6 - School-branded metal water bottle

 Recorder or ocarina if required (you'll be notified in advance).

## **Badges**

At St Peter's, we love celebrating achievement, and wearing badges is one way we show it! Children may wear up to five badges on their blazer. These should be their most recent and highest-ranking badges, such as their highest value house point badge.

Here's how and where to wear them:

- House badges should be worn on the left lapel
- Responsibility badges (e.g. School Council, Prefect, Eco Committee) should be worn on the right-hand side

- Seasonal and event badges (such as Bikeability, Remembrance, or Orchestra Days) may be worn during the term in which the event takes place only

✨ Badges should be worn neatly and securely. Please make sure they are pinned safely and don't cause damage to the blazer fabric. Replacement badges can be purchased through ParentMail.

### **FINAL NOTES**

- ✓ Label everything! Uniform, shoes, bags and stationery must be named
- ✓ All uniform must be correctly-fitted, clean and in good repair
- ✓ Uniform orders should be made via ParentMail
- ✓ Aim to be ready for full transition by September 2025
- ✓ If in doubt, it's always better to pack an extra item!

If your child is missing essential safety equipment (such as a gum shield), the School Office will issue a replacement and the cost will be added to your next invoice. Where uniform is missing, we will make every effort to contact parents so that items can be delivered to school. However, if the uniform is required for an event or fixture, a replacement will be provided and billed accordingly. If uniform is found to be damaged or no longer fits, we will contact you to arrange a replacement. Should this not be resolved in a timely manner, the school will issue the necessary item(s) and add the cost to your next bill.

We hope this guide helps make school mornings easier. Thank you for helping your child feel confident and proud in their St Peter's uniform every day.
